On May 26th, it was like the world stopped in Monticello, Illinois as the funeral procession for Officer Chris Oberheim, who was killed in the line of duty, came to town.

With hands over their heavy hearts, family, friends, first responders and community members said their final goodbyes.

Oberheim, whose community knows him as a hero, is finally home. It was a somber moment for the community.

Police Officer Chris Oberheim was shot and killed at about 3:20 am while responding to a domestic disturbance call at an apartment complex in the 3200 block of North Neil Street in Champaign, Illinois.

He and another officer had arrived at the location and were walking from their patrol cars when they encountered a male subject involved in the disturbance. The man opened fire on both officers, fatally wounding Officer Oberheim. The second officer was also wounded but was able to return fire and killed the subject.

Officer Oberheim had served with the Champaign Police Department for 13 years and had previously served with the Decatur Police Department for seven years. He is survived by his wife and four children.

Oberheim's burial was exclusive to his family, loved ones and first responders. ISA's Executive Director, Jim Kaitschuk, attended the procession and funeral and shared his thoughts later that evening, stating, "I had the honor of attending this remembrance of Officer Chris Oberheim today. I can't think of the words to express my sincere sympathy for this officer's family. He clearly was an amazing father, dad, coach, officer and more.

With that said, as a police officer and Director of the Illinois Sheriffs' Association I want to thank the entire family of Chris Oberheim for their amazing strength, faith and unwavering support for all law enforcement. His wife and daughters have had their lives torn apart but today they displayed their faith in God and demonstrated just how truly strong they are. I truly can't imagine how they were able to share the inspiring words that they did today. To say that were impressive does not say enough.

I also want to recognize the other first responders there as well, whether you were at the service or blocking intersections. I saw you and thank you!

I would be remiss if I didn't recognize all the people that lined the roads, highway and interstate to recognize the sacrifice made by this man and the Oberheim family.

I saw you too and thank you!

Please know that I and many others heard your message today and you can count the Illinois Sheriffs Association and me to carry on your request. We will always be your family. None of you will ever be forgotten."



An Honest Letter: Dear Public



Tonight, 5/10/2021, is Dustin's last shift as a law enforcement officer. I can't even believe I'm writing this. I know many of you who read this will be as shocked as I still am.

Ever since we met 12 years ago, it was all he talked about.

He was getting ready to enter the police academy in Michigan.

It was his dream, the only thing he ever saw himself doing, the only thing he ever wanted to do.

I had never seen a person so passionate about serving.

He dreamed of climbing the ranks, an illustrious 30 year career.

What happened???

9 years of working weekends, nights, holidays, and everything in between.

Sometimes serving a 12, 13, 14 or more hour shift without a drink of water, a meal, or even a bathroom break.

Missing dinners, birthdays, anniversaries, Christmas, school events, funerals, even his own brother's wedding.

Every shift we, his family, hugged and kissed him goodbye, praying for his safe return.

Sending him out into unknown danger to protect you and your family.

My officer, and all those who serve, would lay down their life for yours in a heartbeat.

For you, a complete stranger.

Whether you hate them or not.

Without even taking notice of your race, gender, age, or any way you identify.

Unless you have served, you cannot possibly understand the sacrifice.

The physical and emotional trauma.

Bearing witness to the darkest side of humanity.

Seeing things you couldn't even imagine in your worst nightmares.

All while being hated, cursed, spat on, punched, assaulted, and have others try to end your life simply because you wear the badge.

Seeing your brothers and sisters make the ultimate sacrifice.

As law enforcement families, these are the realities we live every single day.

I just thought life would always be like this.

But when you see your officer's passion, and the good work cops do, most of which goes unnoticed, you understand the sacrifice.

You, yourself, become a part of the sacrifice.

To be a police officer is to be underappreciated and misunderstood.

To be criticized by the media and the public, your every move under surveillance.

To be vilified for doing what is right and just.

To be expected to be robotic, emotionless, and without error.

Hold our public servants to the highest standard of conduct, YES.

But don't demonize an entire profession because of the abhorrent acts of a despicable few.

Police officers are human, yes, just like you.

And they are not immune to error.

Those who willfully do harm are a disgrace to law enforcement and should never have had the honor and privilege of wearing the badge.

Ask any officer and they will agree vehemently.

To the coward hiding behind your keyboard -

You swallow all of the divisive garbage the media feeds you without a second thought.

You aren't qualified to tell law enforcement that they are undertrained and overfunded.

You have no idea how many hours upon hours of training are required to do the job.

You're not an expert on criminal justice or the law.

You're doing more harm than good.

YOU ROBBED MY OFFICER OF HIS PASSION.
